- Extensive excavation tasks, including excavation with shovels, carrying heavy buckets and screening for archaeological materials.
- Knowledge of occupational health and safety policies and procedures.
- Physically able, with or without an accommodation, to extensively perform bending, kneeling, standing, lifting, and carrying objects weighing up to 50 lbs.

- Excellent work ethic and team-player attitude.
- Strong attention to detail, with proven ability to follow specific instructions.
